

TN01 RTO Code – Which District in Tamil Nadu Full Guide

Vehicle registration numbers in Tamil Nadu begin with the state code “TN”, followed by a number that identifies the Regional Transport Office (RTO) responsible for the vehicle. For TN01:

TN = Tamil Nadu

01 = Chennai Central RTO

The remaining letters and numbers distinguish one registered vehicle from another.

For instance, if a vehicle has the registration number TN01 CD 4567, the “TN01” portion indicates that the vehicle was registered under the Chennai Central RTO code, while “CD 4567” identifies its particular registration series and number.

This information can be useful when checking registration documents, transferring vehicle ownership, purchasing a used vehicle or understanding where a vehicle was originally registered.
