

Full List of Maharashtra RTO Offices: Codes, Cities & Contacts

Maharashtra has one of the largest road networks in India, with a wide range of transport services managed through its Regional Transport Offices (RTOs). The **Maharashtra RTO** network helps regulate vehicle registration, driving licences, permits, road safety requirements, and other transport-related activities across different cities and districts.

For vehicle owners, knowing the correct RTO code and office jurisdiction can make everyday transport-related work much easier. Whether you are registering a new vehicle, applying for a driving licence, transferring ownership, or checking vehicle-related documents, identifying the relevant RTO is an important first step.



Maharashtra RTO Codes at a Glance

Maharashtra uses location-specific RTO codes beginning with MH. The number following MH identifies a particular RTO jurisdiction. For example, MH-01 is associated with Mumbai Central, while MH-12 is associated with Pune.

RTO jurisdictions, office names and contact information can change, so vehicle owners should verify the details with the relevant transport authority before visiting an office.

What Services Are Offered by Maharashtra RTO Offices?

RTO offices perform several important functions related to road transport and vehicle administration. The exact services available can vary according to the jurisdiction and office.

1. Vehicle Registration

One of the primary responsibilities of an RTO is registering motor vehicles. When a new vehicle is purchased, the owner generally needs to complete the registration process within the applicable rules.

The RTO verifies the necessary documents and assigns a registration number to the vehicle. Registration-related services can also include renewal, duplicate registration certificates and updates to vehicle records.

2. Driving Licence Services

Maharashtra RTO offices handle various driving licence-related activities. These may include learner's licence applications, permanent driving licences, licence renewals, duplicate licences and changes to licence details.

Applicants may need to complete applicable tests and submit prescribed documents depending on the service requested.

3. Ownership Transfer

When a registered vehicle is sold or transferred, its ownership records need to be updated. The concerned RTO processes the ownership transfer after receiving the required documentation.

Completing this process helps ensure that official vehicle records reflect the current owner.

4. Vehicle Fitness Certification

Commercial and certain other categories of vehicles may require fitness certification. RTO authorities examine vehicles according to applicable requirements to determine whether they are fit for use on public roads.

Fitness certification is particularly relevant to transport vehicles and plays an important role in road safety and regulatory compliance.

5. Permits for Transport Vehicles

RTO offices also deal with permits required for certain transport vehicles. Depending on the vehicle and intended operation, different types of permits may apply.

Vehicle owners and operators should check the applicable permit category and jurisdiction before submitting an application.

6. Road Tax and Other Transport-Related Requirements

RTOs are involved in administering various vehicle taxation and regulatory requirements. The applicable amount can depend on factors such as vehicle category, usage, registration and state rules.

Owners should keep payment records and vehicle documents properly maintained to avoid unnecessary complications.

Documents Commonly Required at an RTO

The documents required depend on the service being requested. However, applicants may commonly need documents such as:

- Proof of identity
- Proof of address
- Vehicle registration certificate
- Valid insurance document
- Pollution Under Control (PUC) certificate, where applicable
- Sale invoice for new vehicle registration
- Ownership transfer documents
- Passport-size photographs, where applicable
- Applicable application forms
- Tax or fee payment receipt
- Other documents specified for the particular service

It is advisable to check the requirements for the specific RTO service before visiting the office because document requirements may differ.

How to Identify the Correct Maharashtra RTO

Finding the correct RTO is important because transport offices generally operate according to defined geographical jurisdictions. Your residential address, vehicle registration details or the nature of the service can determine which office you need to approach.

For instance, someone looking for services related to an MH-14 vehicle would generally need to refer to the jurisdiction associated with that registration code rather than selecting an RTO simply because it is geographically convenient.

The RTO code printed on a vehicle's registration number is therefore a useful starting point for identifying the relevant transport office.

Why RTO Codes Matter

RTO codes are more than just numbers displayed on registration plates. They help identify the registering authority associated with a vehicle.

For vehicle buyers, sellers, insurers and other stakeholders, the code can provide an initial indication of the vehicle's registration jurisdiction. It can also be useful when checking vehicle documents or understanding where registration-related records were originally created.

However, an RTO code should not be treated as proof of a vehicle owner's current residential location, as vehicles can subsequently be transferred between owners or jurisdictions.

Tips Before Visiting a Maharashtra RTO Office

A little preparation can make an RTO visit more convenient. Keep the following points in mind:

- Identify the correct RTO jurisdiction before starting the process.
- Carry original documents where physical verification may be required.
- Keep photocopies or digital copies of important documents when appropriate.
- Check whether an appointment is required for the particular service.
- Ensure that vehicle insurance and other mandatory documents are valid.
- Confirm the applicable government fee before making payment.
- Keep application or transaction receipts safely.
- Recheck names, addresses and vehicle details before submitting forms.

Digital transport services have also reduced the need for physical visits for several routine processes. Nevertheless, some services may still require document verification, testing or an in-person appearance.

Q5. Can I find the RTO from a vehicle registration number?

Yes. The state and RTO code appearing at the beginning of a standard registration number can help identify the registering jurisdiction.
